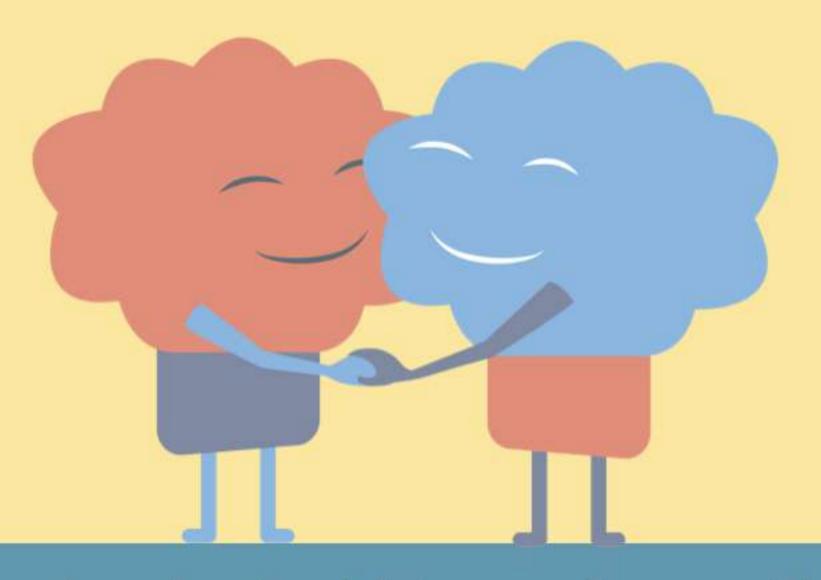
## what to say

what to say: partner violence



"its your choice to be with them. don't complain"



"you deserve a life free of violence"







what to say: partner violence



"why are you still with them? take control of your life"



"i'm sorry this is still happening, are there any options you'd like to explore?"









"if you become more attractive, this will stop"



"the onus to stop violence is not on you. you do not deserve violence and all that you faced is not your fault"









"you think this is because you are earning more than your partner? what if you gave up this job?"



"there is no justification for violence and it is not your fault"









"you must have done something to upset them. what did you do?"



"this is not your fault.
violence is not okay"









"you will bring shame upon your family by speaking out"



"this is your truth and whatever you decide - to speak or not speak about it, you have my full support"









"every relationship/ marriage faces bumps. this will pass"



"violence is not okay. i'm so sorry you're facing this"







when you're talking to someone who has shared their story of partner violence, do not invalidate their experience remember to:

- listen with empathy
- suspend judgment
- talk from a place of love
- get the right kind of help



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
